Hello! My name is Lauri Fletcher, and I am the **Acting Interim Director for** the Indiana Free Library. You may know me as the tech librarian here at the library. I have worked at the library for 18 years.

I began my time here in the Children's department. I then made my way up the staircase where I began working with teens and adults, hosting programs, book clubs and buying books for the teen and fiction collections. My last move was when I transitioned to our digital navigation librarian, where I could help people learn more about technology, teach computer classes and spread the word about all the library's digital resources.

In April, I was asked to be the library's interim director. It is a job that both frightens and excites me. I look forward to all the great things I can help the library accomplish!

One of the things I helped start as the digital navigation librarian is our Chromebook lending service. Chromebooks are a new type of computer designed to help you get things done faster and easier. They run ChromeOS, an operating system with cloud storage, the best of Google built-in and multiple layers of security. Chromebooks can be borrowed for two weeks. come with everything you need to operate them...and are FREE!
